This hall has been closed for a number of years during COVID, and the community felt that they were unable to continue to use the hall for activities or funerals going forward. 

World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation—Season of Creation

In 2021 Pope Francis, proclaimed September 1st—October 4th, the Feast of St Francis of Assisi, as the Season of Creation. With these message, Pope Francis updates the biblical image of the river to the twenty first century. "Let judgement flow like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream". (Amos 5;24). Inspired by the prophet Amos, LET JUSTICE AND PEACE FLOW is the theme of this year's Season of Creation.
