Prayer

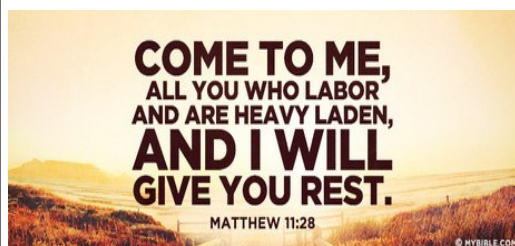

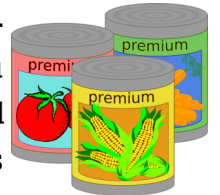
Huge birthday wishes are being sent to Reg Sonier!
