Glooscap

The Wabanaki have been living in New Brunswick and around the Maritime provinces for thousands of years. Meaning "People of the First Light" or "People of the Dawnland," Wabanaki is a confederation of the Mi'kmaq, Maliseet, Passamaquoddy, Abenaki, and Penobscot First Nations. These Nations recorded their histories though storytelling and language. Oral traditions have always been very important to the life of the Wabanaki, and they preserved their knowledge within their generations (Hulan & Eigenbrod 7). One influential legend in their histories is the legend of Glooscap. Like all oral legends, the Glooscap legend has no original author, and there is no date of origin known, but it is nevertheless enjoyed and shared by both the Wabanaki and non-Wabanaki. Today, Glooscap stories can be found in many books and can be heard on the New Brunswick Museum's website ("Koluskap").

The Glooscap legend is essentially a creation story. An embodied persona, Glooscap is considered to be the first human, a great and powerful being who shapes landscapes and shrinks or grows the animals around him. Many versions of the legend suggest that he is responsible for how our current landscape appears. He has been called a cultural hero who was a great *Motewolon* (a man or woman who has learned to wield great power), and was the most powerful being of all (Teeter and LeSourd xvii). Physically he is said to be twice as tall as a regular person, but still looks like an ordinary Indian (Hill and Frankenberg 19).





EASTER SUNDAY HOMILY, YEAR C.

First Reading: Acts 10.34a, 37-43 Responsorial Psalm: 118 R24 "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad." Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 5.6b-8 Gospel: John 20.1-18++

THEME: DID I RESURRECT WITH CHRIST THIS EASTER?

Sing Alleluia, the Lord is risen, is risen indeed, Alleluia!

Our Redeemer who suffered, was crucified, died, and was buried, has risen and glorified. He arose in fulfillment of his promise: "I will rise on the third day." Hence, today we celebrate the triumph of good over evil, of light over darkness, and peace over chaos. We celebrate hope, patience, and the fulfillment of God's Promise to us. We celebrate the uniqueness of our religion, the resurrection of our Lord through which he affirms that he is the Lord of the living and the dead.

We need to ask ourselves this Easter Sunday: Through this forty days long journey, did I resurrect with Christ this Easter? Today's gospel tells us that Jesus left the linen cloths in the grave. In other words, he did not cling to any "worldly" thing or allow them to pull him down. If we must rise with Christ, we must equally be ready to detach ourselves from unnecessary items that pull us down spiritually. Through our Lenten observances, we died with Christ. So let us rise with him through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Like Paul, our song should be that of thanksgiving to God: "We bless God the Father of Our Lord Jesus Christ who in his great mercy has given us a new birth by raising Jesus Christ from the dead". Christ's death was our death, and his resurrection is ours too. Therefore, his joy, glory, and triumph are equally ours.

As Christ's disciples, our testimony from today shall be: "I saw Christ's glory as he rose. Christ, my hope has risen! Like the apostles, our duty is to spread the good news of the Lord's resurrection to the entire world. Like Peter, we need to say to all people: "Now we are those witnesses. We eat and drink with Him after his resurrection."

Having been raised with Christ, we need to act like the living and not the dead. We need to seek the things of light, things that are noble, and things that glorify God. We need to seek heavenly things by living like citizens of heaven. This is what Paul calls us to do today when he says: "Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is."

As we pray to God to help us in this resolve, we join the Psalmist in singing: This is the day the Lord has made, Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia, let us rejoice and be glad.

Wishing you and your families a blessed and spirit-filled Easter celebration.




