### **ASParish Truth & Reconciliation**

Maskwiomin: Our Story
Rekindling the Power of Birch Bark Extract

The traditional Mi'kmaq skincare creation known as Maskwiomin is rooted in the natural power of birch bark. However, this knowledge was nearly lost, as only two Elders in the First Nation community of Membertou in Sydney, Nova Scotia, remembered its origins.

Over 25 years ago, Maskwiomin co-founder and Mi'kmaq elder Tuma Young pieced together lost stories and rediscovered the traditional Mi'kmaq method to extract birch bark's compounds. As an ethnobotanist, Tuma gathered hundreds of plant stories and recipes to ensure this traditional knowledge continues to be shared.

In the Mi'kmaq tradition, making Maskwiomin is a labor-intensive and lengthy process. Birch bark's properties are extracted by carefully enveloping it within a specially-made campfire. Once the fire is out, the thick, viscous, black concentrated bark extract is used to create creams, lotions, and soap products.



Known for its remarkable qualities, birch bark symbolizes transformation in an age-old Mi'kmaq legend. The Mi'kmag tale tells the story of a young woman, tragically mistreated and burdened with scars, blemishes, and uneven skin. One day, she meets a mythical hunter known for his strength, charm, and nobility. Horrified to reveal her appearance, she disguises herself, wrapped head-to-toe in a coiled, hand-made veil of birch bark. But nothing escapes the discerning hunter, who spies her eyes peering out at him. And what he sees is only her true beauty, creating a connection that goes beyond appearances. Finally seen for who she truly is, the woman's deepest struggles are lifted, and her inner light shines through, her natural beauty radiating from within.

This story embodies our appreciation for this extraordinary ingredient and its transformative qualities. It is our greatest joy to share this story, passed down through oral tradition, as an emblem of the enduring power of birch bark.

#### FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER, YEAR C.

**First Reading:** Acts 13.14, 43-52

Responsorial Psalm: 100 "We are his people: the sheep of his pasture."

**Second Reading:** Revelation 7.9, 14b-17

**Gospel:** John 10.27-30

# Theme: The Good Shepherd

The readings emphasize Jesus' role as a compassionate and sacrificial leader for his followers, contrasting him with those who only seek their own interests. The Good Shepherd is depicted as knowing and being known by his sheep, laying down his life for them, and leading them to a place of safety and abundance. The gospel reading highlights the importance of trusting in and following Jesus, our Good Shepherd, who provides for and protects his flock.

# The Characteristics of the Good Shepherd:

**Love and Care**: The Good Shepherd loves his sheep and is concerned for their well-being.

**Leadership and Guidance**: He guides and leads his flock, providing direction and protection.

**Sacrifice and Obedience**: The Good Shepherd is willing to sacrifice himself for his sheep and is obedient to his Father's will.

Do we still hear the voice of Christ our good shepherd echoing in the scripture, in the poor and afflicted, in the sick and dying and in our consciences? As we thank God for the election of our new pope, we pray he may indeed be a shepherd after God's own heart!
