ASParish Truth & Reconciliation

ADA BLACKJACK



In September 1921, four young men and Ada Blackjack, a diminutive 25-year-old Inuk woman, ventured deep into the Arctic in a secret attempt to colonize desolate Wrangel Island for Great Britain. Two years later, Ada Blackjack emerged as the sole survivor of this ambitious polar expedition. This young, unskilled woman--who had headed to the Arctic in search of money and a husband--conquered the seemingly unconquerable north and survived all alone after her male companions had perished.

Following her triumphant return to civilization, the international press proclaimed her the female Robinson Crusoe. But whatever stories the press turned out came from the imaginations of reporters: Ada Blackjack refused to speak to anyone about her horrific two years in the Arctic. Only on one occasion--after charges were published falsely accusing her of causing the death of one her companions--did she speak up for herself.



FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER, YEAR C.

First Reading: Acts 14.21b-27

Responsorial Psalm: 145 "I will bless your name for ever, my king and my God."

Second Reading: Revelation 21.1-5a Gospel: John 13.1, 31-33a, 34-35++

"I give you a new commandment: that you love one another," Jesus said before he died. "Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another."

How has Christ loved?

Agape!

Agape — the "love" that Jesus commanded — is not a feeling, but an act of the will; not something that happens to us, but something we do, intentionally, on purpose — even to someone we might deem unlovable!

Agape seeks nothing for itself, but only the good of the beloved. This is the love God has toward us — not because we are lovable, but because he is love, St. John said. He loves us even when we rebel against him: God "proves his love for us," St. Paul says, "in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

How can we obey Jesus' command to love everyone with this kind of love?

First, we pray for them.

Second, especially during this holy Jubilee year, we communicate to them the "sure and certain hope" we have as Catholics.
